NOTE.—The cost of Reserved Services and the contribution towards Imperial Expenditure are deducted from the proceeds of Reserved Taxes. The net sum due, viz., the Residuary Share of Reserved Taxes, is paid over to the Northern Government by the Imperial Treasury one month in arrear; the Reserved Revenue and Expenditure as well as the contribution for the current month are therefore not included above.
