NOTICE is hereby given, that a Second Meeting of the Creditors in this Matter will be held before the Court, at the Court House, Belfast, on Friday, the 19th day of January, 1923, at the hour of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the Proof of Debts, and for the purpose of deciding upon the offer of Composition made by the Bankrupts or their friends, and which was agreed to by the Creditors at the First Meeting held on the 15th day of December, 1922.
