STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

1936. No. 112.

Determination by the Ministry of Finance under Section 3 of the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland) 1925, of the rates at which charges are to be imposed in respect

of licences for the sale of intoxicating liquor by retail to be granted or renewed during the year ending 30th September, 1937.

In pursuance of sub-sections (3) (b) and (4) of Section 3 of the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, the Ministry of Finance hereby determines that the rates at which charges are to be levied in respect of all licences for the sale of intoxicating liquor by retail granted or renewed during the year ending 30th September, 1937, shall be thirteen shillings and sixpence for each pound sterling of the maximum rates of charges authorised by sub-section (1) of Section 1 of the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925.

AGRICULTURAL MARKETING.
BUTTER AND CREAM.

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, for the purposes of the Butter and Cream Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland), 1936, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 4 (2) of the Agricultural Marketing Act (Northern Ireland), 1933, has made an Order regulating the grading and marking of Northern Ireland creamery butter. EXPORT OF ARMS, EXPLOSIVES AND
AIRCRAFT TO SPAIN.

With effect from the 19th August, 1936, the Board of Trade have withdrawn the application to Spain, Spanish Possessions and the Spanish Zone of Morocco, of the three Open General Export Licences, Nos. G.L. 110, 111 and 112, which were issued on 1st June, 1931, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931.
