WIDOWS', ORPHANS' AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACTS, 1936 AND 1937.

NOTICE is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Minister of Health, acting jointly in conjunction with the Postmaster-General, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Acts, 1936 and 1937, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, to make regulations to be entitled the Contributory Pensions (Special Voluntary Contributors) Regulations, 1937;

And that on account of urgency the National Health Insurance Joint Committee and the Minister of Health, acting jointly in conjunction with the Postmaster-General, under section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made regulations entitled the Contributory Pensions (Special Voluntary Contributors) Regulations, 1937, to come into force immediately as provisional regulations, to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of section 1 of that Act.
