DANGEROUS DRUGS.

ORDER IN COUNCIL APPLYING PART III. OF THE
DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920 (10 AND 11 GEO.
5 C. 46) TO CERTAIN PREPARATIONS.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY
COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

ABERCORN

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section eight of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, as amended and re-enacted by section one of the Dangerous Drugs Act (Northern Ireland), 1932, power is conferred on the Governor of Northern Ireland by Order in Council to declare that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall apply to any drug of whatever kind in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in sub-section (1) of the said section eight if it appears to him that the drug is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, or is capable of being converted into a substance which is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

And whereas it appears to the Governor that all preparations of esters of ecgonine and of their respective salts and all preparations of ecgonine containing less than one-tenth per cent. of ecgonine and all

preparations of esters of morphine are productive if improperly used, or are capable of being converted into a substance which is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine and cocaine:

Now, therefore, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the consent of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the above-mentioned enactment and of all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby order and declare that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall henceforth apply to all preparations of esters of ecgonine or of their respective salts and to all preparations of ecgonine containing less than one-tenth per cent. of ecgonine and to all preparations of esters of morphine in the same manner as the said Part III applies to the drugs mentioned in sub-section (1) of section eight of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920.

MARKETING OF EGGS.

DETERMINATION OF WHOLESALE
DEALERS' PRICES.

ORDER DATED THE TWENTY-SECOND DAY OF
OCTOBER, 1937, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF
AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION ONE OF THE
MARKETING OF EGGS ACT (NORTHERN IRE-
LAND), 1936.

The Ministry of Agriculture, in exercise
of the powers conferred on it by section
one of the Marketing of Eggs Act (North-
ern Ireland), 1936, and of every other power
enabling it in that behalf, and in accord-
ance with advice given by the Egg
Marketing Committee for Northern Ireland
hereby determines as follows, that is to
say:—

1. The prices payable by licensed whole-
sale dealers for eggs delivered during the
week ending Saturday, the 23rd October,
1937, shall be as follows:—

HEN EGGS.

- (a) (i) For hen eggs purchased by a
licensed wholesale dealer from a
producer where the eggs were pro-
duced by the producer's own hens,
1/0 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per lb.:

Provided that where the eggs were
delivered by the vendor to premises
used by a licensed wholesale dealer
of Class A for the testing, grading
and packing of eggs, an additional
halfpenny per lb. shall be paid;

- (ii) For hen eggs purchased by a
licensed wholesale dealer of Class
A from a licensed wholesale dealer
of Class B, 1/1 3-16d. per lb.;

DUCK EGGS.

- (b) For duck eggs purchased by a
licensed wholesale dealer from a
producer where the eggs were
produced by the producer's own
ducks, 1/3 $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per dozen:

Provided that where the eggs were
delivered by the vendor to premises
used by a licensed wholesale dealer
of Class A for the testing, grading
and packing of eggs, an additional
three-farthings shall be paid for
each complete dozen so delivered.

2. This Order may be cited as the
Marketing of Eggs (Determination of
Wholesale Dealers' Prices) (No. 3) Order
(Northern Ireland), 1937, and shall be con-
strued as one with the Marketing of Eggs

(Determination of Wholesale Dealers' Prices) Order (Northern Ireland), 1937.
