RATES OF INTEREST ON GOVERNMENT LOANS.

Loans marked * above are repayable by equal half-yearly instalments of the principal advanced, together with interest on the balance from time to time outstanding. MARKETING OF EGGS (DETERMINATION OF WHOLESALE DEALERS' PRICES) (No. 15) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1940.
