MARKETING OF EGGS (DETERMINATION OF WHOLESALE DEALERS' PRICES) (No. 15) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1940.

Notice is hereby given that an Order has been made by the Ministry of Agriculture determining that the prices payable by licensed wholesale dealers for eggs delivered during the week ended Saturday, 13th April, 1940, shall be as follows:—

- (a) For eggs purchased by Class A licensed wholesale dealers from producers or from Class B licensed wholesale dealers and delivered at the purchasers' Packing Station or at an Approved Depot as specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order.

Hen Eggs 11½d per lb.

Duck Eggs 1/3¼d. per dozen.

- (b) For eggs purchased by Class A licensed wholesale dealers from Class B licensed wholesale dealers and delivered elsewhere than at the purchaser's Packing Station or at an Approved Depot as specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order.

Hen Eggs 11¼d. per lb.

- (c) For eggs purchased by licensed wholesale dealers from producers and delivered elsewhere than at a Packing Station or at an Approved Depot as specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order.

Hen Eggs 11d. per lb.

Duck Eggs 1/3d per dozen.

Deductions:

Hen Eggs—Seconds or Soiled, ½d per egg; Rejects, 1½d. per egg.

Duck Eggs—Rejects, 1½d. per egg.

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

The Paper Box Trade Board (Northern Ireland) hereby give notice that they propose to vary minimum rates of wages and the overtime Provisions set out in their Notices N.I.B. (N. 17) & (N. 20), dated 25th April 1939, and 9th November, 1939, respectively.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the proposed variation of minimum rates and overtime Provisions will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.
