MARKETING OF EGGS (DETERMINATION OF WHOLESALE DEALERS' PRICES) (No. 31) ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1940.

Notice is hereby given that an Order has been made by the Ministry of Agriculture determining that the prices payable by licensed wholesale dealers for eggs delivered during the week ended Saturday, 3rd August, 1940, shall be as follows:—

- (a) For eggs purchased by Class A licensed wholesale dealers from producers or from Class B licensed wholesale dealers and delivered at the purchasers' Packing Station or at an Approved Depot as specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order.

Hen Eggs 1/4½d. per lb.

Duck Eggs 1/11¼d. per dozen.

- (b) For eggs purchased by Class A licensed wholesale dealers from Class B licensed wholesale dealers and delivered elsewhere than at the purchaser's Packing Station or at an Approved Depot as specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order.

Hen Eggs, 1/4¼d. per lb.

Duck Eggs, 1/11½d. per dozen.

- (c) For eggs purchased by licensed wholesale dealers from producers and delivered elsewhere than at a Packing Station or at an Approved Depot as specified in the schedule to the above-mentioned Order.

Hen Eggs 1/4 per lb.

Duck Eggs, 1/11d. per dozen.

Deductions:

Hen Eggs—Seconds or Soiled, ½d per egg; Rejects 2d. per egg

Duck Eggs—Rejects 2d. per egg.
