LONG VACATION, 1940.

Order in Council dated 15th August, 1940, made under Section 30 of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act (Ireland), 1877.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

Whereas by Section 30 of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act (Ireland), 1877, as applied to the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, it is provided that the Governor of Northern Ireland may from time to time by Order in Council, upon a report or recommendation made with the concurrence of the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland by the Council of the Judges of the said Supreme Court assembled in pursuance of the provisions of Section 70 of that Act, make, revoke or modify orders regulating the vacations to be observed by the High Court of Justice and the Court of Appeal in Northern Ireland and in the offices of the said Courts respectively:

And whereas a Council of the Judges of the said Supreme Court, assembled in pursuance of the provisions of the said Section 70 on the 30th day of July, 1940, recommended that the Long Vacation for the year 1940 should terminate on the 31st day of August, 1940, without prejudice to any order which might be made by the said Lord Chief Justice for the purpose of suspending the sittings of the High Court or Court of Appeal under sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the Administration of Justice

(Emergency Provisions) (Northern Ireland) Act, 1939:

And whereas the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland concurs in that recommendation:

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance and by virtue of the enactments hereinbefore mentioned and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order as follows:—

1. The Long Vacation for the year 1940 shall terminate on the 31st day of August.

2. This Order shall be without prejudice to any order which may be made by the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland for the purpose of suspending the sittings of the High Court or Court of Appeal under sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the Administration of Justice (Emergency Provisions) (Northern Ireland) Act, 1939.

3. This Order may be cited as the Northern Ireland Long Vacation (1940) Order, 1940.

INTERNED PERSONS.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Bart., D.L., M.P., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, by this Regulation do make further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and the said Regulation now made, and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulation now made formed part of the said Regulations in the said Schedule, that is to say:—

23 B (1) For the purposes of Regulation 23 B the expression "a Chief Officer of Police or a Police Officer of higher rank" means the Inspector General or the Deputy Inspector General.

BOARD OF TRADE ANNOUNCEMENT.
TRADING WITH THE ENEMY ACT,
1939.

1. The public are reminded that the Trading with the Enemy Act, 1939, makes it an offence, subject to heavy penalties, to trade with the enemy. Trading with the enemy is deemed to include any commercial, financial or other intercourse and dealings with, or for the benefit of, an enemy.

2. The expression "enemy" for the purpose of the Act does not include an individual by reason only that he is a national of an enemy country, but covers—

- (a) any individual resident in enemy territory (including territory in the occupation of the enemy and territory ordered by the Board of Trade to be deemed to be enemy territory for the purposes of the Act). The whole of France, Algiers, Tunisia and French Morocco have been so ordered,
- (b) any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business in any place, if and so long as the body is controlled by a person who is an enemy.
- (c) any body of persons constituted or incorporated in, or under the laws of, a State at war with His Majesty,
- (d) as respects any business carried on in enemy territory any individual or body of persons, whether corporate or incorporate, carrying on that business,
- (e) any other persons specified as an enemy in the schedules annexed to

the Trading with the Enemy (Specified Persons) Orders.

3. The Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1939, No. 1198), requires any money normally payable to, or for the benefit of, an enemy to be paid to the Custodian of Enemy Property. The Custodian of Enemy Property for Northern Ireland is Major F. G. Hill, O.B.E., Royal Courts of Justice, Ulster, Belfast.

4. Any person holding or managing property for or on behalf of an enemy is required to give notice of the fact to the Custodian and to furnish him with such returns and accounts and other information as he may require. Companies incorporated in Northern Ireland and companies incorporated outside the United Kingdom which have a share transfer or share registration office in Northern Ireland are required to furnish in writing to the Custodian full particulars of all securities issued by the company which are held by or for the benefit of an enemy. Every partner and every firm of which any of the partners is an enemy or to which money has been lent by an enemy is similarly required to disclose to the Custodian full particulars of any shares or profits or interest due to such an enemy. Applications for forms for the purpose of making returns relating to the foregoing should be made to the Custodian.
