**W**ALTER HOG, accountant in Edinburgh, trustee on the sequestrated estates of Mess. FRANCIS GARBETT and CO. late of Carron Wharf, and of Mr CHARLES GASCOIGNE, one of the partners of that Company, hereby intimates to the creditors on these sequestrated estates, That Mr James Gibbon, writer to the signet, agent for John Minyer, Esq. executor of the deceased William Pocock of Newgate Street, London, Esq. sometime ago made a proposal to the trustee, for compromising a question which has long depended in the Court of Session respecting the validity of an assignment of nine shares of the stock in Carron Company, standing in Mr Gascoigne's name, granted by him, while factor for the first trustees on these sequestrated estates, to the said William Pocock, in security of a debt due to him by Francis Garbett and Company; the purport of which proposal was, that Mr Minyer, on receiving payment of 1736l. 6s. 3d. which he states to be one half of the balance of the debt remaining due to him; as executor of Mr Pocock at 1st April 1802, and being ranked on the funds of Francis Garbett and Co. and Mr Gascoigne for the other half of the debt, so as to draw therefore the dividends to be declared after the date of the proposal; Mr Minyer would immediately convey to the trustee, for behoof of the creditors, all right which he had to said nine shares of Carron Company's stock, and to the dividends thereon remaining unpaid, since 31st December 1776 inclusive, which now amount to a large sum.

That the trustee, agreeable to previous notice given by him in the news-papers, laid Mr Gibbon's letter, containing said proposal, before the creditors who attended the Annual General Meeting, held at Edinburgh on the 10th of January current. And there was likewise laid before the Meeting a letter on the subject, from Mr Charles Selkrig, accountant in Edinburgh (to whom the Court of Session, several years ago, remitted the process between the creditors and Mr Pocock, for the purpose of making out a report therein) mentioning the difficulties with which the matter is attended, and the litigation which would still be likely to ensue; and stating it as his opinion, that a case so complicated and involved in circumstances, forms the proper subject of a fair and equitable compromise.

That the Meeting having considered the proposal made by Mr Gibbon on the part of Mr Minyer, and the aforesaid letter from Mr Selkrig, were unanimously of opinion, that, in order to avoid the uncalculable delay and expence with which a judicial determination of the matters in dispute with Mr Minyer is likely to be attended, it would be much for the interest of the creditors at large, to accede to the compromise proposed on his part by Mr Gibbon; and therefore, and because the Meeting had not been so fully attended as was expected, they recommended to the trustee to advertise another General Meeting of the creditors, to be held on the 10th of February next, in order finally to decide upon said proposal.

The trustee accordingly hereby requests the whole creditors of the said Mess. Francis Garbett and Co. and Mr Gascoigne, personally, or by their proxies, to meet within the Royal Exchange Coffeehouse of Edinburgh, upon Thursday the 10th of February 1803, at one o'clock afternoon, in order finally to decide upon the aforesaid proposal. — Edinburgh, Jan. 22, 1803.
