WHITEHALL, MARCH 20. 1802.

The King has been pleased to give and grant unto his Excellency Thomas Earl of Elgin, his Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary at the Sublime Porte, his Royal licence and permission to receive and wear the insignia of the Order of the Crescent, given to him by the Ottoman Emperor.

WHITEHALL, AUGUST 21. 1802.

The King has also been graciously pleased to give and grant unto his Excellency Sir John Borlase Warren, Baronet, Knight of the Most Honourable Military Order of the Bath, Rear Admiral of the White Squadron of his Majesty's fleet, and his Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to the Court of St Peterburgh, his Royal licence and permission to receive and wear the insignia of the Order of the Crescent, transmitted to him by the Ottoman Emperor.

And also to command, that these his Majesty's concessions and declarations, together with the relative documents, be registered in his College of Arms.
