(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA).

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 26th day of July 1889.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following area (namely),—at Corstorphine, in the County of Edinburgh, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by Gyle Muir Road, on the east by a wall separating Andrew Brook's premises from those of Thomas Dick, on the south by a wall separating premises of Andrew Brooks, I. Scott, and Robert Meikle, from fields of South Gyle and Corstorphine Bank Farms, and on the west by a wall separating Robert Meikle's premises from those of William Lees,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-seventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine.
