By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1886, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following Area,—namely, in the County of Fife, comprising the whole Farm of Dalginch, in the Parishes of Kennoway and Markinch, in the occupation of David Normand, which was declared, by Order of the Board of Agriculture, dated the fourth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
