Order, under Section 108, appointing new Election for the Cowgate East Division of the County of Dumbarton, and authorising the Provisional Council of the County to meet and transact business, notwithstanding any vacancies in their number.

Whereas a difficulty has arisen as to holding the first Election of a County Councillor for the Electoral Division of Cowgate East, in the County of Dumbarton; and it appears to me necessary, for the proper holding of the said first Election, that a new Election be appointed :

I, therefore, the Most Honourable Schomberg Henry, Marquess and Earl of Lothian, K.T., Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, in virtue

of the powers vested in me by the 108th Section of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, direct a new Election to be held on Thursday the thirteenth day of March 1890, of a County Councillor for the said Electoral Division. Nominations must be made not later than four o'clock afternoon, on Tuesday the fourth day of March 1890 :

And I hereby authorise the Provisional Council of the County of Dumbarton to meet and transact business, notwithstanding any vacancies in their number.
