**DOWNING-STREET, March 22.**

By dispatches received this morning from the Earl of Elgin, his Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary at Constantinople, dated January 15. 1803, it appears, that the differences which had subsisted between the Sublime Porte and the Beys of Egypt, have been satisfactorily arranged through the mediation of his Majesty's Ambassador.

**ST JAMES'S, March 16.**

The following Address has been presented to the King; which Address his Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

To the KING'S Most Excellent Majesty.

We, the Lord Provost, Magistrates, and Council of the City of Edinburgh, for ourselves, and in name of the community of the City, with grateful thanks to Almighty God, beg leave most sincerely to congratulate your Majesty on the providential discovery of the designs of the late traitors against your Majesty's person, family, and government. While we lament that persons should be found, who, after experiencing the blessings of your Majesty's reign, and contemplating the virtues of your private character, are capable of harbouring a thought against your sacred life, it must be a source of real satisfaction to your Majesty to reflect, that such designs are never entertained but by men of desperate and abandoned characters; and we hope that the late most just and necessary examples will secure your Majesty from all secret conspiracies; and that your Majesty's virtues, and the firmness of your Government, will ever prove insuperable obstacles to their success.

We further beg leave to return our grateful thanks to your Majesty, for that decision of mind, which induced your Majesty to waive the gratification of your own merciful disposition for the safety and happiness of your people.

Against the open attacks of your enemies, foreign and domestic, we pledge ourselves and our fellow citizens, in common with the rest of your faithful people, to defend your person and family, with our lives and fortunes.
