the Most Honourable Schomberg Henry, Marquess and Earl of Lothian, K.T., Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, having carefully considered the Petition laid before me by the District Board of the River Stinchar, in terms of the 9th section of the Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868, for an alteration of the annual close time for Rod Fishing applicable to the said District, and being satisfied that the requisite statutory formalities have been duly complied with by the said District Board, and that it is expedient that the annual close time for angling applicable to the District of the River Stinchar should be altered, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868, as read with the Secretary for Scotland Act, 1885, order that the annual close time for

Rod Fishing applicable to the District of the River Stinchar, shall in future extend from the fifteenth day of November to the twenty-fourth day of February annually, both days inclusive, instead of as at present from the thirty-first day of October to the twenty-fourth day of February annually; and I do hereby direct that this Order shall be published in the Edinburgh Gazette of twelfth August 1890.
