LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1889.

BURGH OF ABERDEEN.

Determination under Section 59.

Whereas by section 59 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, it is provided that 'Where the Parliamentary area of a County or Burgh differs from its area within the meaning of this Act, the Secretary for Scotland may determine which shall be the administrative and rating authority under the Contagious Diseases

(Animals) Acts in any portion of such area, and his determination shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, have the same force and effect as if it were enacted in this Act: Provided that such determination shall not limit the powers of the Boundary Commissioners under this Act.'

And whereas the Parliamentary area of the Burgh of Aberdeen differs from its area within the meaning of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889.

Now therefore, I, the Most Honourable Schomberg Henry, Marquess and Earl of Lothian, K.T., Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, hereby determine that the Council of the County of Aberdeen shall be the administrative and rating authority under the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts in that portion of the area of the Parliamentary Burgh of Aberdeen which is outwith the area of the Burgh of Aberdeen within the meaning of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889.
