

ment (Scotland) Act, 1889, determine and order as follows:—

I. Subject to the provisions of the said Act, the aforesaid part of the Parish of St. Leonards, situated at or near Kenly, and the aforesaid part of the said Parish marked on the Ordnance Survey Maps St. Leonards detached No. 3, and so much of the aforesaid part of the said Parish marked on the Ordnance Survey Maps St. Leonards detached No. 2 as lies to the west of the centre of Abbey Street, shall cease to be part of the Parish of St. Leonards, and shall form part of the Parish of St. Andrews.

II. Subject to the provisions of the said Act, so much of the Parish of St. Andrews as lies to the westwards and northwards of a line starting at low-water mark at a point near Kinkell Harbour, opposite the centre of the track known as the Ware Road, where the said road reaches the sea, running thence direct to the said Ware Road and along the centre thereof in a westerly and southerly direction until it reaches the centre of the road from St. Andrews to Boarhills opposite the eastern march of the lands of Brownhills, thence to and along the said eastern march in a southerly direction to the southmost point thereof, thence in a westerly direction along the south march of the lands of Brownhills till it meets the Anstruther and St. Andrew's Road, thence in a southerly direction along the centre of the last-mentioned road to the point where the cross road to Allanhill leaves it; and to the eastwards and seawards of a line starting from the last-mentioned point, and running in a westerly direction along the centre of the said cross road to the point at which the footpath called the Latch leaves it, thence in a generally northerly direction along the said footpath past Balmungo until it reaches the road from Grange to St. Andrews, then along the centre of the last-mentioned road, and of St. Mary Street, Abbey Wall, Abbey Street, and South Castle Street to the centre of North Street, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of North Street till it meets the western boundary of the aforesaid part of the Parish of St. Leonards, marked on the Ordnance Survey Maps St. Leonards detached No. 1, and along the said western boundary to low-water mark, shall cease to be part of the Parish of St. Andrews, and shall form part of the Parish of St. Leonards.

III. This Order shall come into operation for the purposes of school board elections on the 1st day of February 1891, and for all other purposes on the 15th day of May 1891.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following Places (namely)—(1) the byre at Lauderberry, in the occupation of Mr. James Kinghorn, in the Parish of Echt, in the County of Aberdeen, and (2) the byres and cattle sheds situate on the Overtown Farm, in the Parish of Memsie Rathen, in the County of Aberdeen, in the occupation of Mr. James Birnie, which were declared by Orders of the Board, dated respectively the thirtieth day of September, and the eleventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia, are hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and those Places shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety.

(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following Place (namely)—the premises and the buildings thereon at Gown Brig, Canal Road, in the Burgh of Aberdeen, in the occupation of Mr. Charles Mason, which was declared by order of the Board, dated the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
