(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following Area (namely)—the farm steading of Portobello, in the Parish of Tranent, in the County of Haddington, tenanted by Mr. William Courtney, farmer there, including byre, cattle-close, and cattle-sheds, also fields called Cow Park, Stackyard Field, and Dovecot Field, bounded on the north by the North Railway, on the south by the public road leading from Bank Park, Brickword, to the Tranent Colliery Railway, on the south-east by the said private Railway, and on the west by the Tranent Branch of the North British Railway, including all public roads within the said boundaries, which was declared by Order of the Board, dated the fourteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and ninety, to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with pleuro-pneumonia.

DUNDEE WATER.

Enlargement and Raising of Water level of Lintrathen Reservoir: New Aqueducts, Conduits, or Lines of Pipes, and other Works: Alterations of Levels and Diversions of Roads and Appropriations of Portions of existing Roads: Power to Impound Waters and Streams: Compensation Water: Reduction of Present Compensation Water Supply: Compulsory Acquisition of Lands: Extensions of Limits and of Compulsory Limits of Supply, and Application thereto of Powers and Provisions of Existing Acts: Valuation of Undertaking and Rating thereof: Powers to enter into Agreements: Confirmation of Agreements with North British Railway Company, Commissioners of Police of Tayport, and Parochial Board of Monifieth: Raising of Further Money and other Powers: Provisions as to Sinking Fund, and Reduction and Suspension thereof: Rates, Charges, and Assessments, and Alteration of Existing Rates, Charges, and Assessments: Alteration and Amendment of Constitution of Commissioners: New Provisions as to Supply for Domestic Purposes beyond Limits for Compulsory Supply: Supply within County of Perth:

Powers to Make New and Additional Bye-Laws: Repeal, Alteration, and Amendment of Acts: Incorporation of Acts, and other Powers and Purposes.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that it is intended to apply to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill to effect the objects and purposes after-mentioned, or some of them, or some parts or portions thereof, and to enable the Dundee Water Commissioners (hereinafter called the Commissioners) to effect the objects and purposes after-mentioned, or some of them, or some parts or portions thereof, that is to say:—

(a) To enable the Commissioners to construct, make, lay down, and maintain the following Works, or some of them, with all proper Conveniences, Approaches, and Accommodations connected therewith, vizt. :—

1. An Extension and Enlargement of the Reservoir of the Commissioners in the Parish of Lintrathen and County of Forfar, commonly called or known as the Lintrathen Reservoir, so as to increase the area thereof and raise the water therein above the present top water level of the said Reservoir, by adding to and increasing the height of the main embankment of the said Reservoir, and of the waste weir thereof, and of the waste weir walls and other works thereof: commencing the said Extension and Enlargement, so far as regards the said main embankment, at a point thereon 370 yards or thereby South-Westward, measuring along the said embankment from the South-West wing wall of the waste weir of the said Reservoir, and terminating on the said embankment at the East end of the South-West wing wall of the said waste weir, and consisting, said extension and enlargement, so far as regards the said waste weir, of the raising of the height or level of the said waste weir, including the masonry slopes thereof along the full length of the same, and, so far as regards the said waste weir walls, of the raising of the existing wing walls of the said waste weir at each side of the said weir, and, so far as regards the other Works, of the raising of the masonry, bridges, gangways, and sluice gearing of the compensation outlet upstand, and of the town outlet upstand, and other works. The Reservoir will be extended 200 yards or thereby on the North, 30 yards or thereby on the South, 30 yards or thereby on the East, and 20 yards or thereby on the West.

2. An alteration of the levels and raising of a portion of the public carriage road leading from Alyth, by Milnacraig, to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen, commencing at a point in the said road 93 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line South-Westward from the centre of the town's outlet upstand in the said Lintrathen Reservoir, and terminating at a point in the said road 100 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line South-Eastward from the centre of the said outlet upstand.

3. A diversion of the said Public Carriage Road leading from Alyth, by Milnacraig, to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen, commencing at a point in the said road 370 yards or thereby, and terminating at a point in the said road 450 yards or thereby, both measured in a straight line North-Eastward from the junction therewith of the road leading therefrom to Craigyloch.

4. A diversion of the said Public Carriage Road leading from Alyth, by Milnacraig, to and beyond Bridgend of Lintrathen, commencing at a point in the said road 520 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line North-Eastward from the junction therewith of the road leading therefrom to Craigyloch, and terminating at a point in the said Public Carriage Road, 130 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line South-Westward from the South-West corner of the Corn and Meal Mill at Bridgend of Lintrathen.

5. An alteration of the levels and raising of a portion of the Public Carriage Road on and along the East side of the Lintrathen Reservoir, and crossing part of said Reservoir, commencing at a point in the said road 595 yards or thereby measured in a straight line South-Westward from the South West corner of the dwelling-house of Foldend, Lintrathen, occupied by Thomas Fenton, and terminating at a point in the said road 180 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line South-Westward from the South-West corner of the said dwelling house of Foldend, Lintrathen.

6. An alteration of the levels and raising of a portion of the Public Carriage Road leading from Kirriemuir to Glenisla, commencing at a point in the said road 450 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line South-Eastward from the South-East corner of the dwelling-house of Inzion, Lintrathen, occupied by William Annand, and terminating at a point in the said road 166 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line South-Eastward from the South-East corner of the said dwelling-house of Inzion.

7. An alteration of the levels and raising of a portion of the Public Carriage Road on the North-West side of the Lintrathen Reservoir, commonly called the Road by Boghall, or Boghall Road, and afterwards in this Notice called Boghall Road, commencing in the said road where it joins the Public Carriage Road from Kirriemuir to Glenisla at a point 20 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line Southwards from the South-West corner of the Farm Steading of Inzion, Lintrathen, and terminating at a point in the said Boghall Road at or near the centre of the Bridge, commonly called Boghall Bridge, carrying that road over the River Melgum.

8. An alteration of the levels and raising of a portion of the said Public Carriage Road, commonly called Boghall Road, commencing at a point in that road at or near the centre of the said Bridge carrying the same over the River Melgum, and terminating at a point in the said road 115 yards or thereby Southward, measured along the said road from the centre of the said Bridge.

9. A diversion of the Public Carriage Road on the West side of the Lintrathen Reservoir (sometimes called the Lochside Road), and of the continuation thereof leading Northwards, sometimes called the Road by Kinloch, or the Kinloch Road, commencing at a point in said Lochside Road 350 yards or thereby, and terminating at a point in said Kinloch Road 150 yards or thereby, both measuring in a straight line South-Westward from the South-East corner of the dwelling-house commonly called Kinloch, Lintrathen, occupied by Mrs. Alexander.

10. An alteration of the Bridge, commonly called Boghall Bridge, carrying the said Boghall Road over the River Melgum, constructed under the powers of "The Dundee Water Extension Act, 1871," by the substitution of iron beams and

steel trough floor plates for the existing stone archways of the said Bridge.

All which said several Works hereinbefore described will be wholly situate in the Parish of Lintrathen, in the County of Forfar.

11. An aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes commencing in the Parish of Alyth and County of Perth, in and by a junction with the existing line of pipes firstly described in and laid under "The Dundee Water Amendment Act, 1872," at a point 5 yards or thereabouts Northward from the North wall of the sluice house on said existing line of pipes, commonly called the Shangie Sluice House, and terminating by a junction with the said existing line of pipes in the Parish of Alyth and County of Perth at a point 286 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line Northward from the North-East corner of the Isla Sluice House of the Commissioners, situate on the South Side of the River Isla; and which intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes will be situate in and will pass from, in, through, or into the Parish of Alyth, in the County of Perth, and the Parish of Ruthven, in the County of Forfar, or one of them.

12. A Bridge (across the River Isla), commencing in the Parish of Alyth, in the County of Perth, at a point 286 yards or thereby, measuring in a straight line Northward from the North-East corner of the said Isla Sluice House, and terminating in the Parish of Meigle, in the County of Perth, at a point 86 yards or thereby, measuring in a straight line Southward from the said North-East corner of the said Isla Sluice House; which Bridge will be situate in and will pass from, in, through, or into the said Parishes of Alyth and Meigle, in the County of Perth, or one of them.

13. An aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes commencing in the Parish of Alyth, in the County of Perth, in and by a junction with the existing line of pipes of the Commissioners, firstly described in and authorised by "The Dundee Water Act, 1882," at a point 286 yards or thereby, measuring in a straight line Northward from the North-East corner of the said Isla Sluice House, and crossing the River Isla by means of the intended bridge, being Work 12 hereinbefore described, and terminating in the Parish of Meigle in the County of Perth, in and by a junction with the said existing line of pipes at a point 86 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line Southward from the North-East corner of the said Isla Sluice House; and which intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes will be situate in, and will pass from, in, through, or into the said Parishes of Alyth and Meigle, in the County of Perth, or one of them.

14. An aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes commencing in the Parish of Alyth, in the County of Perth, in and by a junction with the said intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes, being Work 11 hereinbefore described, at a point 286 yards or thereby, measuring in a straight line Northward from the North-East corner of the said Isla Sluice House, and crossing the River Isla by means of the intended bridge, being Work 12 hereinbefore described, and terminating in the Parish of Meigle, in the said County of Perth, in and by a junction with the intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes, being Work 15, and next herein-after described, at a point 86 yards or thereby, measured in a straight line Southward from the North-East corner of the said Isla Sluice House,

and which intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes will be situate in, and will pass from, in, through, or into the said Parishes of Alyth and Meigle, in the County of Perth, or one of them.

15. An aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes, commencing in the Parish of Meigle and County of Perth, in and by a junction with the intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes, being Work 14 hereinbefore described, at the point of termination thereof, and terminating by a junction with the line of pipes firstly described in, and laid down under "The Dundee Water Amendment Act, 1872," at a point in that line, within the Parish of Newtyle and County of Forfar, 80 yards or thereabouts, measured in a straight line North-Eastwards from the North-East corner of the dwelling-house of Hatton of Newtyle, in the said Parish of Newtyle, and County of Forfar; and which intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes will be situate in, and will pass from, in, through, or into the Parish of Meigle, in the County of Perth, and the Parish of Newtyle, in the County of Forfar, or one of them.

16. An aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes commencing in the Parish of Newtyle and County of Forfar, in the Reservoir of the Commissioners in the said Parish and County commonly called or known as Pitnappie Reservoir, at the South-East corner thereof, and terminating in the West end of the inlet well of the Reservoir of the Commissioners in the united Parishes of Mains and Strathmartine and County of Forfar, commonly called or known as the Clatto Reservoir; and which intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes will be situate in and pass from, in, through, or into the Parish of Newtyle, the Parish of Auchterhouse, the United Parishes of Liff, Logie, Benvie, and Invergowrie (commonly called Liff and Benvie), and the United Parishes of Mains and Strathmartine, or one or more of them, all in the County of Forfar.

17. An aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes commencing in the East end of the inlet well of the Reservoir of the Commissioners, commonly called or known as the Clatto Reservoir, and terminating in the sluice chamber of the Commissioners, situated and being on the North side of the Clepington Road of Dundee, and which intended aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes will be wholly situate in the united Parishes of Mains and Strathmartine and County of Forfar.

Together with all necessary and proper embankments, dams, weirs, channels, sluices, catch-water drains, culverts, cuts, aqueducts, tunnels, bridges, roads, cisterns, gauges, main and distributing pipes, houses, buildings, and all other works and conveniences, or alterations of any existing works, conduits, aqueducts, mains, pipes, or conveniences whatsoever, which may be necessary or expedient for effecting or carrying out the objects or purposes of the Bill, or any of them; and to enable the Commissioners to extend, alter, replace, increase, and enlarge their existing works, conduits, aqueducts, mains, and pipes, and the works, aqueducts, conduits, mains, and pipes to be authorised by the Bill, and to extend, alter, replace, enlarge, and increase the number and size of the works, mains, and pipes for conveying and distributing water for the purposes of the Bill.

(b) To disjoin, uplift, remove, and appropriate the existing line of pipes of the Commissioners, firstly described in and laid under "The Dundee Water Amendment Act, 1872," from the com-

mencement to the termination of the aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes, being Work 11 hereinbefore described, and from the commencement to the termination of the aqueduct, conduit, or line of pipes, being Work 15 hereinbefore described.

(c) To stop up and discontinue, and to vest in the Commissioners, and to enable them compulsorily or otherwise to take, appropriate, and use for the purposes of their undertaking the portions of the public carriage roads mentioned in and proposed to be diverted by Works 3, 4, and 9, hereinbefore described, between the points of commencement and termination of the said intended diversions thereof respectively hereinbefore described, and to provide that said Works 3, 4, and 9 shall, on the completion thereof, form part of the said roads respectively, and shall be managed and maintained by the authorities, bodies, or persons respectively entitled and liable to manage and maintain the same.

(d) To deviate laterally from the lines and situations of the said intended works within the limits shown upon the plans hereinafter mentioned, or as shall be specified in the Bill; and to deviate vertically from the levels of those works, as shown upon the sections hereinafter mentioned, or as shall be specified in the Bill.

(e) To collect, intercept, divert, and take into and impound and store up in the said extended and enlarged Lintrathen Reservoir for the purposes of the undertaking of the Commissioners and of their special Acts after-mentioned and of the said Bill, the waters of the Loch of Lintrathen and affluents thereof, and of the River Melgum and affluents thereof, and of the Inzion Burn and affluents thereof, all in the County of Forfar, in so far as not heretofore collected, intercepted, diverted, and taken into and impounded and stored in the existing Lintrathen Reservoir, and from thence by the existing undertaking and works of the Commissioners and the said intended works, or one or more of them, to use and appropriate the said several waters for an additional supply of water to the City and Burgh of Dundee and Suburbs, and places adjacent, and other places presently supplied and proposed to be supplied with water by the Commissioners within the limits of "The Dundee Water Act, 1869," and extensions and proposed extensions thereof, and to the inhabitants of the said limits and extensions and proposed extensions; and to provide compensation water to streams and persons whose present supply of water may be affected by or in consequence of the works to be authorised by said Bill, or any of them, and to supply such other persons, Corporations, or Public Authorities as the Commissioners may think fit, or otherwise as may be provided in the said Bill.

(f) To make provision for the discharge and regulation of compensation water to mill and factory owners, lessees, and occupiers, and all others affected by the existing and intended works of the Commissioners, to reduce the quantity of compensation water prescribed by Section 15 of "The Dundee Water Extension Act, 1871," and to alter and amend the provisions of that Act with reference thereto, and to the failure or default in the supply of compensation water, and to make other provisions in relation to the premises.

(g) To carry the works proposed to be authorised by the Bill through, over, under,

across, along, upon, or into, and for that purpose, as well as for the purpose of maintaining the same, and any conveniences connected therewith, and also for the purpose of laying down, maintaining, taking up, altering, and repairing mains, pipes, culverts, and other works for the distribution of water within the Commissioners' present and proposed extended limits of supply, and for the other purposes of the Bill, from time to time, temporarily or permanently to open, break up, use, cross, divert, alter, or stop up any public highway, County or other public road, or other road, foot-path, street, canal, railway, tramway, bridge, stream, river, water-course, sewer, aqueduct, reservoir, drain, pipe, Electric Telegraph or Electric Lighting tube, wires, or apparatus, or place.

(h) To acquire by compulsory purchase or by voluntary agreement, and to hold for the purposes of the said intended Bill, and of the undertaking of the Commissioners, lands, houses, and other property, and easements and servitudes in, over, and under lands, houses, and other property, and easements and servitudes and rights-of-way through, over, or in, or under rivers, streams, railways, tramways, bridges, public highways, and County and other public roads, occupation roads, and other roads or ways, and to vary or extinguish not only all rights and privileges which might in any way interfere with the execution, maintenance, or use of the intended works, or of the existing and authorised works of the Commissioners, but generally all rights and privileges which it may be considered expedient to vary or extinguish, and to confer all new powers, rights, and privileges which it may be considered expedient to confer.

(i) To authorise the Commissioners to use, apply, and appropriate to any of the purposes of the intended Bill any lands, houses, and property, or any easements or servitudes in, or over, or under any lands, houses, or property already vested in or belonging to them, or which may become vested in or purchased by them; and to authorise the sale of all surplus lands, heritages, and works already vested, or which may become vested, in the Commissioners.

(j) To make provision for the protection of the said intended works, and for defining and regulating the supply of water by them and by all existing works of the Commissioners, and for the filtering of the water authorised to be taken and conveyed by any of the works of the Commissioners or of any part thereof; and also for defining and confirming the existing and intended undertaking of the Commissioners, and aqueducts, conduits, or lines of pipes already laid down by them, as well as those to be laid down by them under the powers of the Bill, and for the maintenance thereof, and to make other provisions in relation thereto.

(k) To extend the limits within which the Commissioners are authorised to supply water in the County of Forfar so as to include the following additional area in the Parish of Monifieth in the said County, viz., the area embraced by a straight line drawn from the North-East corner of the present limits in the said Parish (at Ordnance bench mark indicating altitude 142.8 on the Dundee and Arbroath public road, within the Parish of Monifieth in the County of Forfar) in a North-Easterly direction to the Ordnance bench mark indicating altitude 123.8 on Greystone Old



Toll-house on said Dundee and Arbroath public road, and thence in a straight line South-Eastward to the centre of the bridge carrying the Dundee and Arbroath Joint Railway over the Buddon Burn in the said Parish of Monifieth, and thence in continuation of said line South-Eastward to the Firth of Tay, the Southern boundary being the Firth of Tay, from the said extended East boundary at said Firth West to the present limits at said Firth.

(l) To apply and make applicable to the extended limits and to the Commissioners all or some of the powers and provisions of the special Acts of the Commissioners hereinafter mentioned, and of "The Water Works Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863," subject to such alterations, additions, and variations as the Bill may prescribe.

(m) To extend the present limits of compulsory supply fixed by "The Dundee Water Act, 1869," and "The Dundee Water Act, 1882," so as to include within the compulsory limits the areas within the following extensions, viz. :— (1) Extension on the East, in the County of Forfar, commencing at the North-East corner of the present limits for compulsory supply at the junction of the road leading Eastward from Barnhill Steading with the Barnhill Road, thence in a straight line North-Eastward to the North-most point of the boundary of the Special Water Supply District of the Local Authority of the Parish of Monifieth, under the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1867, and Acts amending the same, and thence Eastward and Southward along the Eastern boundary of said Local Authority's said district to the Firth of Tay, the boundary on the South being the Firth of Tay, from the said extended East boundary at said Firth West to the present limits at said Firth, all in the parish of Monifieth and County of Forfar. (2) Extension on the North, in the County of Forfar, commencing at the present limits for compulsory supply at the ordnance bench mark indicating altitude 294.6 on the Mains Road where joined by the roads leading to East Balgray and West Balgray, thence in a straight line North-West to ordnance bench mark indicating altitude 290.9 at the junction of the road leading from Baldovan to Baldovan Mill with the road on the South side of the Dighty Water or Burn which goes Eastward to Balmuir and Harestane, thence in a straight line North-Westward to the South-East corner of the farm buildings of Old Baldragon, thence in a straight line South-Westward to the West end of St. Mary's Road, where it joins the road leading North to and beyond St. Mary's farm-steading, thence South-East in a straight line to a point on the road from American Muir to King's Cross, said point being two hundred and fifty yards due North from the North boundary of the Parliamentary Burgh of Dundee, measuring South from the said point, the boundary on the South being the North boundary of the present compulsory limits of supply from the bench mark 294.6 before referred to to the point on the road from American Muir to King's Cross hereinbefore described, all in the United Parishes of Mains and Strathmartine and County of Forfar. (3) Extension on the East, in the County of Fife, viz. :—(a) The Police Burgh of Tayport, and (b) the area lying between the West boundary of the said Burgh of Tayport and the East boundary of the Special Water Supply District of the Parish of Forgan, in the County of Fife, commencing at

a point in the West boundary (Crossgreen to Downie Well) of the said Police Burgh of Tayport, 290 yards South from Downie Well, measured along said Crossgreen to Downie Well boundary, and running West in a straight line to the East boundary of the said special water supply district to a point in said boundary near Northfield, and 400 yards South from the centre of the public road between Newport and Tayport, measured along the line of the said East boundary of said special water supply district, thence Northward along said Eastern boundary of said special water supply district to the Firth of Tay, the boundary on the North being the Firth of Tay, from the said East boundary of said special water supply district at the Firth of Tay Eastward to the Burgh of Tayport, all partly in the Parish of Ferry-Port-on-Craig and partly in the Parish of Forgan, both in the County of Fife.

(4) Extension on the West, in the County of Fife, commencing by a junction with the South-West boundary of the said Special Water Supply District of the Parish of Forgan at a point in said boundary 620 yards or thereby (measured in a straight line Eastward on and along said boundary) from the centre of the public road near Woodhaven, thence in a straight line South-Westward to the North end of Flass Cottage, presently occupied by Henry Smith, thence South-Westward and South-Eastward along an imaginary line indicating altitude of 200 feet ordnance datum to a point where said imaginary line would cross the road from Wormit to Wormithill at 200 feet ordnance datum, thence in a straight line South-Westward to the junction of the public road to Leuchars with the road to and beyond Naughton and thence North-Westward in a straight line to Peashills Point on the Firth of Tay, the boundary on the North being the Firth of Tay, all partly in the Parish of Forgan and partly in the Parish of Balmerino, both in the County of Fife; and to apply and make applicable to the extended limits of compulsory supply to the same extent as they are applicable to the present compulsory limits the whole provisions and enactments of the Commissioners' special Acts, viz., "The Dundee Water Act, 1869;" "The Dundee Water Extension Act, 1871;" "The Dundee Water Amendment Act, 1872;" "The Dundee Water (Additional Powers) Act, 1874;" and "The Dundee Water Act, 1882;" and of the several Acts incorporated therewith, or some parts or portions thereof respectively, including the powers to assess and levy "The Domestic Water Rate" and "The Public Water Rate," presently assessable and leviable within the existing limits of compulsory supply, with such additions, amendments, and alterations as the Bill shall prescribe, and in particular with power to charge, assess, and levy over the said districts proposed to be included within the compulsory limits, or any of them, the same Domestic and Public and other Rates as are, or higher Domestic and Public and other Rates than are or may be charged, assessed, and levied within or over the existing compulsory limits.

(n) To make such provisions as may be deemed expedient in reference to the valuation of the undertaking of the Commissioners, and the rating thereof; and to alter and amend the rules of valuation, and rating applicable thereto; and, in particular, to provide that for the purposes of the whole rates, assessments, and charges leviable upon the undertaking of the Commissioners, the

annual value of the under-ground works of the undertaking shall be held to be one-fourth or such other proportional part as the Bill shall prescribe of the amount entered as the annual value thereof in the Valuation Roll, or the nearest aggregate sum of pounds sterling to such proportional part, and to provide for the division of said valuation and rating among the Parishes and Burghs interested in the undertaking.

(o) To enable the Commissioners, on the one hand, and any owners of lands or other heritages, and also any person or persons, Company, Corporation, Trustees, Authority, Board, or body interested in, or affected by any of the objects of the Bill, on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect agreements for or in relation to the purchase of any lands or heritages made or to be made by the Commissioners, or for or in relation to the objects aforesaid, or any of them, and to confirm with or without variation all or any agreements which may have been, or during the progress of the Bill may be, entered into touching the same, and in particular to confirm with or without variation, alteration, amendment, or addition—(1) An agreement between The North British Railway Company, incorporated by Act of Parliament, of the first part, and the Commissioners, of the second part, with reference to a pipe for supplying water laid along the New Tay Viaduct, dated 28th April and 12th May, both 1887; (2) A Minute of Agreement between the Commissioners, of the first part, and the Commissioners of Police for the Burgh of Tayport, and Peter Kinnear White, Clerk to and on behalf of the said Commissioners, and in name and as representing them, on the second part, with reference to the supply of water by the Commissioners to that Burgh, dated 5th and 9th September 1889; and (3) A Minute of Agreement between the Commissioners, of the first part, and the Parochial Board of the Parish of Monifieth, being the Local Authority of the Landward Part of said Parish, of the second part, with reference to the supply of water by the Commissioners to the Special Water Supply District of such Local Authority, dated 26th and 30th September 1889, as well as any supplementary or other Agreement to be entered into and made applicable to said Agreements, or the subject thereof, between the said parties preceding the deposit or during the progress of the Bill.

(p) To incorporate with or without modification, amendment, alteration, or addition, all or some of the provisions of "The Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," and "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Acts Amendment Act, 1860," and all amendments thereof; "The Water Works Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1863," "The Railways Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845," "The Railways Clauses Act, 1863," "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863," "The Debenture Stock Act, 1871," and "The Local Loans Act, 1875," and any Acts amending the same, or some of the said Acts or some parts thereof, and to amend the said Acts, or some of them, or some parts thereof, and to apply the said Acts, or some of them, or some parts or portions thereof, with or without modification, amendment, alteration, or addition to the several works or some of them to be authorised by the said Bill and to the undertaking of the Commissioners, and to the monies authorised or to be

authorised to be raised by them, and otherwise as the Bill may provide.

(q) To authorise the Commissioners to raise by borrowing or otherwise further money for the purposes of their undertaking and of the intended Bill, on the credit and security of their undertaking, and of the rates, assessments, and charges, or some of them already authorised, or to be authorised, to be levied by the Commissioners; to remove any legal disability affecting any person or persons, body or bodies, lending money to, or entering into Contracts with the Commissioners, and to vary, extend, alter, or enlarge the existing powers and obligations of the Commissioners with respect to rates, assessments, and charges, borrowing of money and borrowed money; and to the levying and recovering of rates, assessments, and charges.

(r) To provide that the whole or any portion of the Loans, Debts, and Borrowed Money now owing by the Commissioners and any money to be hereafter raised or borrowed by them, may be provided for, borrowed, or raised by the creation and issue of Perpetual or Terminable Debentures or Consolidated Stock, or Perpetual or Terminable Debenture Stock or Annuities, Deposit or other Receipts, to be charged on all, or any, or some of the rates, charges, assessments, or securities of or leviable by the Commissioners specified in the special Acts of the Commissioners above specified, and to be authorised by the Bill, or as such intended Bill may provide; and to provide for the conversion of existing Loans, Debts, and Borrowed Money by agreement with the holders thereof respectively, or otherwise, into any such Debentures, Stock, or Annuities; and also to make provision as to the form of Debentures and Certificates of Stock and Annuity Certificates, and in particular to authorise such Debentures and Certificates of Stock and Annuity Certificates, or any of them, to be made payable to the bearer of the Debenture or Certificate of Stock or Annuity Certificate, or to a person to be named therein, his executors, administrators, or assigns, and also to provide that Debentures and Certificates of Stock or Annuities made or issued to bearer shall or may be transferred and transferable by delivery, and to make other provisions with reference to the transfer of Debentures and Stock or Annuity Certificates where the same are made payable to a person named therein, his executors, administrators, or assigns, or to bearer, and to provide and make provision as to the issuing of Interest Warrants or Coupons with reference to any such Debentures, Stock, or Annuities; and, further, to make provisions with regard to the rate of interest payable or to be paid on any such Debentures, Stock, or Annuities; and also to make provisions as to the Registration of Debentures and Certificates of Stock and Annuity Certificates and Deposit or other Receipts, and the transfer thereof, and to authorise a Register or Registers of all or any of such Securities to be made and kept, and to provide for the inspection and rectification of the same, and generally to make further and other additional provisions as to Borrowed Money and the Borrowing of Money and as to the Raising of Money by creating and issuing Debentures, Consolidated Stock, and Perpetual or Terminable Debenture Stock, and Annuities, and Deposit or other Receipts, or any of them or otherwise.



(s) To make provision for the exemption from stamp duty of transfers of the Debentures, Consolidated Stock, and Perpetual or Terminable Debenture Stock, and Annuities of the Commissioners, upon such terms and subject to such payments by way of composition as may be prescribed by the Bill.

(t) To authorise the investment of Trust Funds in the Securities existing or future of the Commissioners, and to exempt the Commissioners from liability in respect of notice of any Trust affecting money advanced to them.

(u) To make new provisions with respect to the repayment of the existing Loans, Mortgages, Debenture Stock, and Securities of the Commissioners, and any additional money to be borrowed or raised, and to repeal the provisions in the special Acts of the Commissioners above mentioned in relation to Sinking Funds in whole or in part, or otherwise to alter or reduce the amounts, and to suspend or extend the periods for such Sinking Funds as to the whole or some part of the Loans, Mortgages, Debenture Stock, and Securities provided by the said Acts to be extinguished thereby; and to make other provisions as to or in lieu of Sinking Funds, and to convert all or part of such Loans, Mortgages, Debenture Stock, and Securities into a Permanent Debt or Stock.

(v) To empower any person holding any Mortgage, Debenture Certificate, Bond, or Security of the Commissioners, and being a person enabled by the "Lands Clauses Consolidation (Scotland) Act, 1845" (Section 7), to sell land, to consent to the conversion of such Mortgage, Debenture Certificate, Bond, or Security into any Debentures or Stock or Annuities of the Commissioners.

(w) To alter and amend the constitution of the Commissioners for the purpose of making the Chief Magistrate of the Burgh of Newport, and his successors in office, for the time being, a Commissioner in the room and place of the Chairman of the Parochial Board of the Parish of Forgan, and to make all necessary provisions with respect thereto, and, if necessary, to reincorporate the Commissioners.

(x) To vary, amend, extend, alter, or repeal, in so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the said intended Bill, the before-mentioned special Acts of the Commissioners, or some of them, or some parts of the said Acts and the Acts applicable to the undertaking of the Dundee Water Company, now vested in the Commissioners, recited in "The Dundee Water Act, 1869," or some of them, or some parts or portions thereof, and specially the provisions of the said special Acts, or some parts of the same as to Estimates, Rates, and Revenues, and the application thereof and otherwise; and to authorise the Commissioners to alter and enlarge existing charges, rates, and assessments, and to assess and levy charges, rates, and assessments, and new additional, increased, and other charges, rates, and assessments throughout the whole of their limits of supply, including the extended limits proposed by the Bill; and also to alter and modify Sections 36 and 48 of "The Dundee Water Act, 1869," with reference to the rates and charges in respect of a supply of water within the existing and proposed extended limits of supply beyond the limits of compulsory supply under the said Acts of 1869 and 1882; and further, to authorise the Commissioners to charge, assess,
