- Translation into English from Latin, or French, or German.
- *** Candidates failing in any of the abovenamed subjects will not be admitted to the competitive part of the Examination.

PART II.—COMPETITIVE.

(A) Obligatory.

Any one or two of the following subjects which the authorities of the Science and Art Department may on any occasion prescribe:—

- 1. Chemistry, Inorganic.
- 2. Chemistry, Organic.
- 3. Physics, including Heat, Light, Sound, Electricity, and Magnetism.
