(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The

Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this second day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
