Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

- 1. The following Place (namely)—the byres and sheds at Damside, Silvermills, in the Parish of St. Andrew, in the Burgh of Edinburgh, in the occupation of Mr. William Wilson, which was declared by Order of the Board, dated the second day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia, is hereby declared to be free from pleuro-pneumonia, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order cases. as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
- 2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of February one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.
