The Queen has been pleased to order a Congé d'Élire to pass the Great Seal, empowering the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough to elect a Bishop of that See, the same being void by the promotion of the Most Reverend Father in God Doctor William Connor Magee, late Bishop thereof, to the See of York; and Her Majesty has been pleased to recommend to the said Dean and Chapter the Reverend Mandell Creighton, D.D., Canon of Worcester, Dixie Professor of Ecclesiastical History in the University of Cambridge, to be by them elected Bishop of the said See of Peterborough.

THE ORKNEY PLEURO-PNEUMONIA MOVEMENT ORDER of 1891.

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Prohibition of Movement.

1. (1) No cattle shall be moved into the County of Orkney from the District of any other Local Authority in England or Wales or Scotland except as provided by this Order:

- (i.) Cattle may be moved into the County of Orkney from the County of Zetland with a Declaration of the owner, or of his agent authorised in writing for that purpose, declaring that, to the best of his knowledge and belief, each of the cattle to be moved is not affected with pleuro-pneumonia, and has not been exposed to the infection of pleuro-pneumonia, and has been in the possession of such owner or agent for a period of at least three months immediately before the making of the Declaration.
- (ii.) Breeding bulls may be moved into the County of Orkney from the District of any other Local Authority in Scotland, which District is for the time being free from pleuro-pneumonia in accordance with the following conditions (namely):—

(a.) The bulls may be moved into the County of
