

## INTIMATION.

WHEREAS the Manufacturing Company in Glasgow, some time carried on under the Firm of OSWALD, GILFILLAN, and CO. of which the individual Partners were, James Henry Oswald of Dryburgh, James Gilfillan, and John Graham, was, by mutual consent, DISSOLVED on the 25th of August, 1802, and legal Notice of the Dissolution immediately made in the Edinburgh Gazette, and Glasgow Newspapers: notwithstanding whereof it soon thereafter appeared that the said JAMES GILFILLAN, either for his own accommodation, or for the accommodation of different persons with whom he was concerned in different branches of business, most improperly had presumed to put the Signature of OSWALD, GILFILLAN, and Co. to a variety of Bills and Promissory Notes, in which the Company of Oswald, Gilfillan, & Co. had no interest or concern, or any idea of such improper transactions; which coming to the knowledge of the other partners, Messrs Oswald and Graham, they immediately complained thereof; and the said James Gilfillan having admitted the gross illegality and impropriety of such transactions, offered, and accordingly found, security, to the satisfaction of Messrs Oswald and Graham, for their complete indemnification and retirement of all such illegal obligations, under high penalty; and Messrs Oswald and Graham, in consequence thereof, were led to understand that all such obligations were taken out of the circle, until lately they have found that other promissory notes and bills besides those originally consigned upon, on which the signature of OSWALD, GILFILLAN, and Co. had been affixed by the said James Gilfillan, were still in the circle; and although Messrs Oswald and Graham do certainly consider themselves as not liable to fulfil any of the obligations thus come under by the said James Gilfillan, under the signature of Oswald, Gilfillan, and Co. yet they think it proper to make this public intimation to all concerned, and to request, that if there are still in the circle any promissory notes, bills, or other obligations, on which the said James Gilfillan may have dared to affix the signature of Oswald, Gilfillan, and Co. for which he had no legal title or authority, either in the character of obligants, acceptors, or indorsers, on such notes, that they will immediately make intimation thereof to Mr Archibald Cuthell, writer in Glasgow, or Mr George Napier, writer in Edinburgh.
