LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1889.
ORDER BY THE BOUNDARY COMMISSIONERS FOR SCOTLAND.

COUNTY OF ABERDEEN.

ELECTORAL DIVISIONS.

WHEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, determined the number of Councillors to be elected to the County Council of Aberdeen to be sixty-five, and has apportioned them as follows, viz.:—For the Burgh of Peterhead, three; for the Burgh of Kintore, one; for the Burgh of Inverurie, one; and for the County, including Police Burghs, sixty:

And whereas by the Aberdeen Corporation Act, 1891, the Police Burghs of Old Aberdeen and Woodside have been included within the limits of the Burgh of Aberdeen, and, consequently, in virtue of section 4 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, the number of County Councillors for the County, including Police Burghs, has been reduced from sixty to fifty-eight:

Now, therefore, we, the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland, after due inquiry and consultation with the Authorities concerned, and after considering all objections and representations relating to the Proposed Order issued by us on 31st July 1891, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the said Act, determine the contents and boundaries of the Electoral Divisions of the County of Aberdeen to be as follows:—
