(PLEURO-PNEUMONIA.)

By the Board of Agriculture.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Board of Agriculture Act, 1889, and The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Acts, 1878 to 1890, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The limits of the following Places which are declared by Orders of the Board to be Places infected with pleuro-pneumonia (namely)—(1) the cow-byres, stables, straw-sheds, yards, and all other premises at Silvermills, in the Burgh of Edinburgh, in the occupation of Mr. William Wilson, Mr. John Linklater, and Mr. Samuel Cowan, cowfeeders, (2) the sheds situate at East Silvermills Lane, in the Parish of St. Andrew, in the Burgh of Edinburgh, in the occupation of Mr. William Wilson, and (3) the yard, byres, and sheds at Silvermills, in the Burgh of Edinburgh, in the occupation of Mr. John Niven—are hereby extended so as to include the Place described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Place described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Place infected with pleuro-pneumonia.
- 2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after this fifth day of January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.
