LOCAL GOVERNMENT (SCOTLAND) ACT, 1889.

ORDER BY THE BOUNDARY COMMISSIONERS FOR SCOTLAND.

COUNTY OF STIRLING.

ELECTORAL DIVISIONS.

WHEREAS the Secretary for Scotland has, under the provisions of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, determined the number of Councillors to be elected to the County Council of Stirling to be forty-five, and has apportioned them as follows, viz. :—For the Burgh of Falkirk, two ; and for the County, including Police Burghs, forty-three :

Now, therefore, we, the Boundary Commissioners for Scotland, after due inquiry and consultation with the Authorities concerned, and after considering all objections and representations relating to the Proposed Order issued by us on 8th December 1891, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the said Act, determine the contents and boundaries of the Electoral Divisions of the County of Stirling to be as follows :—

3	Balfron	The parish of Balfron.
4	Fintry & Killearn	(1) The parish of Fintry, and (2) the parish of Killearn.
5	Strathblane	The parish of Strathblane.
6	Baldernock	The parish of Baldernock.
7	Lennoxton	That part of the parish of Campsie which is included within the following boundary, viz. a line starting at the level crossing on the Blanc Valley Railway line at Rowantreefauld, and running thence first in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the said railway
