ORDINANCE No. 19.

[St. Andrews, Aberdeen, and Edinburgh, No. 2.—Libraries.]

At Edinburgh, the twenty-second day of March eighteen hundred and ninetytwo years.

WHEREAS by the Universities (Scotland) Act, 1889, the Commissioners under the said Act are empowered, by section 14, sub-section 16, to repeal or modify any Ordinance made under the

provisions of the Universities (Scotland) Act, 1858:

Therefore the Commissioners under the firstmentioned Act statute and ordain as follows:—

Ordinance numbered 68 of the Commissioners under the Universities (Scotland) Act, 1858, is hereby repealed, in so far as it is inconsistent with the Ordinance numbered 8 [St. Andrews, Aberdeen, and Edinburgh, No. 1.—Libraries and Museums] of the Commissioners under the Universities (Scotland) Act, 1889.
