This day the Lords being met, and the Commons attending, the Royal Assent, by Commission, was given to

An act for raising five millions, by loans or Exchequer bills, for the service of the year 1803. An act for granting certain duties on the importation of goods, wares, and merchandize exported from Ireland; and also certain duties of Excise on spirits and malt distilled in Ireland. An act for defraying the charge of the pay and clothing of the militia in Great Britain for the year 1803. An act for granting certain allowances to Adjutants and Serjeant Majors of the Militia of England disembodied. An act for the improvement of the port of London—and to three English road and private acts.

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Commission in the Stirlingshire Regiment of North British Militia, signed by his Majesty.

Campbell, to be Adjutant. Dated June 5, 1803.

Commission in the Lanark Regiment of Militia, signed by the Lord Lieutenant.
