M. and by the perseverance of every officer and man employed in landing the remainder of the troops, the Lieutenant-General was enabled to make an early arrangement for an attack on that very important and firong post, Morne Fortunee, bled, which, on the Commandant refusing to live up when summoned, was ordered to be attacked with that decision and promptitude which has always been the characteristic mark of Lieut. Gen. Grinfield, and carried by florm at half past four this morning, with the superior bravery which has ever distinguished the British foldier: this plac d the colony completely in our pof-fession.

To Capt. Hallowell's merit it is impoffible for me to give additional encomium, as it is fo generally known; but I must beg leave to fay, on this expedition, his activity could not be exceeded; and by his friend ly advice I have obtained the most effectual aid to this fervice, for which he has been a volunteer, and, after the final difembarka-tion, proceeded on with the feamen to cooperate with the army. The marines of the squadron, by defire of the Lieutenant-General, were landed and ordered to take post near Gros Ilet, to prevent supplies being thrown into Pigeon Island, which, on the

The King has been pleased to cause it to be fignified by the Right Honourable Lord were all anchored by eleven o'clock in this Hawkesbury, his Majesty's Principal Se-hav. Ministers of neutral powers residing at this Court, that the necessary measures having been taken by his Majesty's command, for the blockade of the entrance of the River Weser, in consequence of his Majesty having recently received authentic information of the occupation of parts of the banks of that river by the French troops, the faid river is declared to be in a flate of blockade; and that from this time, all the measures authorifed by the law of nations, and the refpe live treaties between his Majerty and the different neutral powers, will be adopted and executed with respect to all vessels which may attempt to violate the faid blockade. Lord Hawkesbury has been further commanded by his Majesty to signify to the Ministers of the neutral powers, that whenever the French troops will evacuate the positions which they now occupy on the parts of the banks of the Weser, and will remove to fuch a distance from them as to leave the course of that river perfectly free and secure to the vessels of his subjects, as well as of other nations, his Majetty will immediately direct his thips of war which may be stationed at the mouth of the river Wefer, for the purpose of blockading the same, to be withdrawn.

WHITEHALL, JULY 29. 1803.
