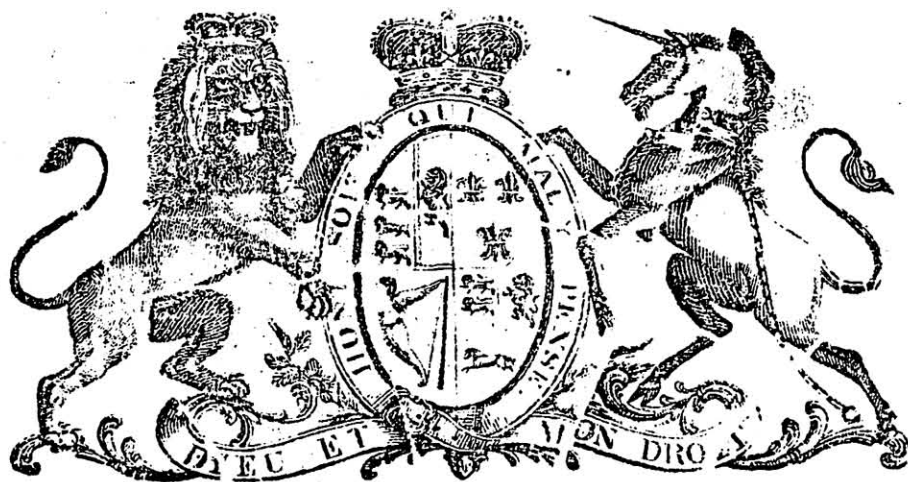

Copy of a Letter from the Hon. William Cornwallis, Admiral of the Blue, &c. to Sir Evan Nepean, Bart. dated off Ushant, the 30th July.

SIR,

I have the honour of enclosing a letter from Captain Bedford, of the Thunderer, giving an account of his having taken a French ship privateer, which might have very much distressed the trade of his Majesty's subjects, had not Captain Bedford's active zeal prevented her taking a single vessel belonging to England.

SIR,

Thunderer at sea, July 26.

I have the honour to report to you, that on the 26th inst. I captured the Venus French privateer, pierced for 28 guns, mounting 16 six pounders, and two eight pound carronades, 150 men, commanded by Monsieur Lemperierre.

She is a fine vessel, quite new, sails remarkably fast, well found, coppered, and measures 358 tons from the report I have received she is calculated for his Majesty's service. She sailed from Bourdeaux the 21st inst. in company with 4 other privateers. I have the honour to remain, &c.
