I am to request you will lay before my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the inclosed copy of a letter I have this day written to Vice-Admiral Lord Nelson, giving an account of the re-capture of his Majesty's late ship Ambuscade, by the ship under my command.

Victory, off Gibraltar, June 12. 1803. MY LORD,

I beg to acquaint your Lordship, that, on Saturday the 28th ult. in lat. 45 deg. 40 min. long. 6 deg. 10 min. west, I captured the French national frigate L'Embuscade, (late his Majesty's ship Ambuscade, of 32 guns), commanded by Monsieur Fradin, Captain de Vaisseau, and manned with 187

The Ambuscade was from Cape Francois bound to Rochfort; out 30 days.
