Admiralty-Office, August 23. Copy of a letter from the Hon. WILLIAM CORNWALLIS, Admiral of the Blue, &c. to Sir Evan Nepean, Bart. dated off Ushant, the 18th inft.

I have the honour to acquaint you, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that a lugger was feen within the rocks at Ushant, which had the appearance of an armed vessel. Boats from the Ville de Paris, under the direction of Lieutenant Watt, went on

the 16th at night, and brought her out.

She is called the Meffager, pierced for 8 guns, has fix mounted, with the owner and forty men. on board, completely fitted for a two months

Lieutenant Watt boarded her with eighteen men in a pinnace before the other boats, which had separated to look out for her, could get up. Only a few Frenchmen king a feeble refistance.
