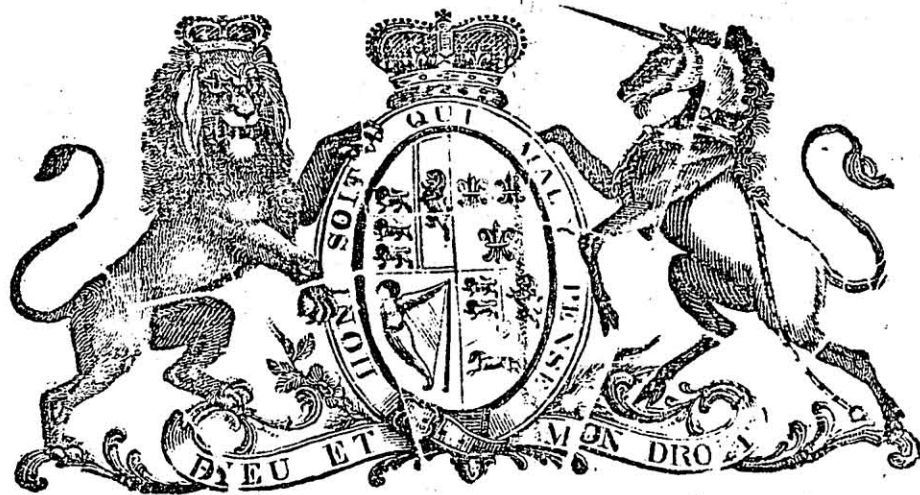

Copy of a letter from Captain AYLMER, of his Majesty's sloop Wasp, to the Hon. Capt. C. BOYLE, of the Seahorse frigate, dated the 19th July 1803.

SIR,
I beg leave to acquaint you, that in the execution of your orders, per signal, to look out S. W. I discovered and captured, after a chase of two hours, Le Desespoir French privateer, a lugger, mounting two guns, pierced for ten, commanded by Jean Delaballe, and manned with 28 men; belonging to Hodiernne, which she had left only three days before, and I have the satisfaction to add, had made no captures.
