The King has been pleased to cause it to be signified by the Right Hon. Lord Hawkesbury, his Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, to the Charles of Neutral Powers residing at this Court, that his Majesty has thought proper, for the defence of his dominions, and the protection of his subjects, to take the most effectual measures for the blockade of the entrance of the port of Havre de Grace, and the other ports of the Seine; and that from this time all the measures authorised by the law of nations, and the respective treaties between his Majesty and the different Neutral Powers will be adopted and executed with respect to all veffels which may attempt to violate the faid
