## WILD BIRDS PROTECTION ACTS, 1880 to 1894.

### COUNTY OF BERWICK.

ORDER by the Secretary for Scotland.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the 'Wild Birds Protection Act, 1894,' and upon application by the County Council of the County of Berwick, I, the Right Honourable Sir George Otto Trevelyan, Baronet, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Orders:—

1. The taking or destroying the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the entire County of Berwick for a period of one year from the 1st day of July 1895, viz. :—

Dipper (*Cinclus aquaticus*).  
Redstart (*Ruticilla phoenicurus*).  
Stonechat (*Pratincola rubicola*).  
Lark (*Alauda arvensis*).

Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*).  
Barn Owl (*Strix flammea*).  
Long-eared Owl (*Asio otus*).  
Tawny Owl (*Syrnium aluco*).  
Goldfinch (*Carduelis elegans*).  
Bullfinch (*Pyrrhula europæa*).  
Redpole (*Linota rufescens*).  
Siskin (*Chrysomitris spinus*).  
Wagtail (*Motacilla raji*).  
Kingfisher (*Alcedo ispada*).  
Snipe (*Gallinago cœlestis*).  
Ringed Plover or Sealark (*Aegialitis hiaticula*).  
Tern (common) (*Sterna fluviatilis*).  
Teal (*Querquedula crecca*).  
Woodpecker (great spotted) (*Dendrocopus major*).  
Cuckoo (*Cuculus canorus*).  
Dunlin (*Tringa alpina*).  
Redbreast (*Erithacus rubecula*).  
Heron (*Ardea cinerea*).  
Rock Pipit (*Anthus aquaticus*).  
Sandpiper (*Totanus hypoleucus*).

2. The 'Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880,' shall apply within the County of Berwick to the following species of Wild Birds as if they had been included in the Schedule to the said Act, viz. :—

Dipper (*Cinclus aquaticus*).  
Redstart (*Ruticilla phoenicurus*).  
Stonechat (*Pratincola rubicola*).  
Peregrine Falcon (*Falco peregrinus*).  
Bullfinch (*Pyrrhula europæa*).

Redpole (*Linota rufescens*).  
 Siskin (*Chrysomitris spinus*).  
 Wagtail (*Motacilla raji*).  
 Redbreast (*Erithacus rubecula*).  
 Heron (*Ardea cinerea*).  
 Rock Pipit (*Anthus aquaticus*).  
 Missel Thrush (*Turdus viscivorus*).  
 Wren (*Troglodytes parvulus*).  
 Coal Tit (*Parus britannicus*).  
 Blue Tit (*Parus cœruleus*).

The foregoing Orders shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1895.

Alteration of Parish Areas.

PROPOSED ORDER No. XXXI.

PARISHES OF DALKEITH AND NEWBATTLE.

WHEREAS it has been represented to me by the Commissioners of the Police Burgh of Dalkeith that I should issue an Order under section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, and section 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1894, detaching from the Parish of Newbattle the portion thereof situated within the boundaries of the Police Burgh of Dalkeith, and attaching it to the Parish of Dalkeith;

And whereas, after consulting with the Authorities concerned, and causing a local inquiry to be held, I am of opinion that it is expedient to give effect to the said representation;

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir George Otto Trevelyan, Baronet, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon the Secretary for Scotland by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows:—

1. The portion of the Parish of Newbattle situated within the boundaries of the Police Burgh of Dalkeith shall cease to be part of that Parish, and shall form part of the Parish of Dalkeith.

2. The Parish Council of Dalkeith shall assume responsibility for, and shall relieve the Parish Council of Newbattle of all advances which the latter body may be called upon to make for or on account of, any pauper whose claim is derived (1) from birth in the said portion of the Parish of Newbattle prior to the 10th day of August 1895, or (2) from residence for the statutory period in the said portion of the Parish of Newbattle prior to the 10th day of August 1895.

3. Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights of Creditors or of persons having vested interests, and all questions of adjustment consequential on this Order are expressly reserved.

This Order shall take effect on the 10th day of August 1895.
