No LONDON GAZETTE has been received in town this morning.

TO THE CREDITORS OF WILLIAM CRAWFORD, Spirit-dealer in Dreghorn.

AT the meeting held on the 21st of September current, the bankrupt made offer of a composition of 11s. per pound of the whole debts due by him, and to find sufficient security for 8s. thereof; of which, 4s. to be payable on his obtaining a discharge from the Court, 4s. in three months thereafter, and for the remaining 3s. to grant his own bill, payable at nine and fifteen months from the date of obtaining the discharge.
