SPECIAL LIGHTING DISTRICTS.

Borrowing Powers of County Councils.

ORDER BY THE SECRETARY FOR SCOTLAND.

WHEREAS it is enacted by sub-section (6) of section 44 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1894, with respect to the formation of Special Lighting Districts, that any expenditure attending the formation of a special district, or the carrying out within such special district of the purposes of this section or of any of them, shall be paid out of an assessment to be imposed by the County Council within the special district, to be called the Special District Rate, and levied along with and as an addition to and in excess of the Public Health Rate, and with the same remedies and modes of recovery; provided that such Special District Rate shall not exceed ninepence in the pound on the annual value of the lands and heritages within the special district as ascertained for the purposes of the Poor Law (Scotland) Act, 1845, and a County Council may borrow for such of the said purposes as the Secretary for Scotland may by Order prescribe on the security of such Special District Rate.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do by this Order, under my hand and seal, prescribe that a County Council may, in terms of the said sub-section, borrow money for the following purposes:—

1. The purchase and laying of main gas pipes.

2. The purchase and erection of gas lamps, lamp posts, and pillars.

Alteration of Parish Areas.

PROPOSED ORDER No. XXXIV.

PARISHES OF DUNBLANE, BLACKFORD, AND MUTHILL.

(NEW PARISH OF ARDOCH.)

WHEREAS by Decree of the Lords of Council and Session, dated 21st February 1855, certain portions of the Parishes of Dunblane, Blackford, and Muthill, all as more fully described in the said Decree, were disjoined from these Parishes and erected into a separate Parish, since known as the Parish of Ardoch, excepting only in so far as regards the support and management of the poor, and all matters and questions connected herewith;

And whereas it has been represented to the Secretary for Scotland by the School Board of Ardoch that he should issue an Order under section 51 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, and section 46 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1894, forming the foresaid
