FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1878 to 1895.

In pursuance of Section 1 of 'The Rules Publication Act, 1893,' notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State proposes, at the expiration of forty days from the publication of this notice, to make an Order under section 33 of 'The Factory and Workshop Act, 1878,' exempting certain Factories from the requirements of that section with regard to lime-washing.
