Copy of a letter from Captain Griffiths, of his Ma. jeny's fhip Constance, to Caprain Broughton of the Penelope, transmitted by Lord-Keith.

His Majesty's ship Constance, moored in the Elbe, Sept. 22, 1803.

The two French privateers which were fitting out up the Elbe at Harbourgh in Hanover, viz La Caroline of 8 guns, and 35 men, and La Sophie of 10 guns and 40 men, both schoolers, I received intelligence on the 18th had come down to Cuxhaven two days before, but as I found they were infide the Jettys, I could do nothing with them: on the 20th they came out with a fair wind, and a view. I believe, of trying the vell is, exercifing the people, and escaping by the North Elbe, should chance befriend them . .: I dispatched all the boats atter them under Lieutenant Napier, but the e was too much wind and fea, in fuch a tide's way, to admit their attacking them. They appear, however, to have succeeded in causing them to separate, the Caroline hauling her wind for Cuxhaven, La Sophie hearing up for the North, Elbe, the litter run on shore on the fouth part of the Vogel fund, when the other bore up to prevent the boats destroyin her. Next morning I got uncer weigh and succeeded in cutting off-the Caroline from Cuxhaven, whom I capthe Caroline from Cuxhaven, whom I cap-tured about two miles from that place. The wind increasing, on sending to anchor near the one on shore, the struck ber colours al-

so, and the boats attempted to take the people out, but the heavy sea on the fand ren-dered it impossible; during the night the wind chopped round to the N.W. and blew very hard: It brought fo high a tide, that at 3 in the morning-the got off with the loss of her rudder, and I thould imagine otherwife a good deal damaged, however the reached Cuxnaven I think.
