#### By the KING: A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

Whereas our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the 3d day of November next: We, with the advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued on the faid 3d day of November next to Tuesday the 22d day of November next; and we have given order to our Chancellor of that part of our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And we do further hereby, with the advice aforefaid, declare our royal will and pleafure; that the faid Parliament shall, on the said 22d day of November next, be held and fit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeffes, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said 22d day of November next.

Given at our Court at St James's the 12th day of October 1803, in the 43d year of our reign.
