Copy of a letter from Vice Admiral Gambier, com-mander in chief of his MajeRy's ships and vest, is at Newfoundland, to Sii Evan Nepean, Bart dated on hoard the Isis, at St Jono's, the 20th Auguft 1803.

I fend herewith an extract of a letter from Cap-tain Malbon, of his Majesty's ship Aurora, giving an account of his having taken possession of the islands of St Pierre and Miquelon, which you will be pleased to lay before the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Extract of a letter from Captain Malbon, commanding his Majesty's ship Aurora, to Vice-Admiral Gambier, commander in chief at Newfoundland,

On the 30th June, about four in the morning, I made the island of Peters; and at g fent the large cutter and launch, manned and armed with a 12pound carronade, under the command of Lieut. Richard Longfield Davier, and Lieut, Baillie, of the Marines, to oblige the town to jurrender, or begin the attack; between 6 and 7 o'clock they entered the harbour, under a thick fog, and perceiving a bost croffing from one five to the other, brought her to, in which they found the Commissary, who acted as Governor. The confusion that the place was thrown into from the fudden attack prevented the inhabitants from affembling together, and by delivering the colours to Lieuteriant Davies.

From what has been fince learned there is no doubt, that, if the inhabitants could have had time to have collected themselves from their different fituations, they would have made a strong resistance, having since discovered upwards of one hundred Commanders are arrived in L'Aventure.

Found here a French metchant brig (Le Reines des Anges) and a schooner (Le Provoyier), with eleven small schooners, and upwards of one hundred battoes. The island contained fith, stores, falt, and merchan dife of various descriptions, and, upon a rough survey, about 220 men were upon the island and in the boats; but they being fo detached feveral got away in the 'mall craft, one of which, I have fince been informed, was taken off Liverpool in Nova Scotia, and another at St Lawrence, in Newfoundland.

On every thing being fecured, I ordered one of the fifting ichooners to be fitted as a tender, and having her manned and armed with a 12-pound carronade, gave the command to Lieut. Davies, with directions to fcour the coast, and take post-ifion of the islands of Great and Little Miquelon, which he did; but no inhabitants or stores were found at either of thefe places.

I have to beg you will acquaint my Fords Commissioners of the Admiralty, that on the 27th uit, being off Vigo, I captured, after feveral bours chale, L'A erte French brig privateer, of 14 gars, Prench fix and four painters, and 84 men, conditioned by Bernsrd neugania chaurd, on hear feweral bours of cruife, having been 65 days from Bourdeaux. The mafts, fails, and rigging are much torn by our first, and the man at the helm (the only man fuffered on deck) dangerously wounded. I have fent five-wounded prisoners on flore, to the care of the French Conful at Oporto.
