# ORKNEY AND ZETLAND SMALL PIERS AND HARBOURS.

(Formation of Special Districts for the Construction of Small Harbour Piers and Boatslips in Counties of Orkney and Zetland; Powers to District and Parish Councils; Compulsory Purchase of Lands; Borrowing of Money; Application of Acts.)

A PPLICATION is being made by a Bill now pending in the House of Commons, under the above short title, for an Act for the following or some of the following among other purposes,

that is to say:-

To enable the Parish Council of any Landward Parish in the Counties of Orkney or Zetland, or a certain number of the electors of such Parish, to require the District Committee of the County in which the Parish is situate, to constitute the same or a portion thereof a special district for the construction of small harbours, piers, and boatslips, and to enable such District Committee to adopt the powers of the Public Health (Scotland) Acts with reference to special districts for water supply or drainage, the borrowing of money, the compulsory purchase of lands, and the levying of special assessments therein, and to make those powers and certain powers of the Local Government (Scotland) Act, 1889, applicable to the purposes of the intended Act.

To extend to the Pier and Harbour Districts so formed certain provisions of the Western Highlands and Islands Works (Scotland) Act, 1891, and to confer on the District Council the powers thereby conferred on the County Council.
