Utrecht, in the Downs, My Lord; Oct. 29. 1803. Herewith I enclose a letter from Captain Brenton, of his Majesty's sloop Merlin, stating the destruction of the French lugger privateer Les Sept Freres.

The conduct of Lieut. Thompson, and the people serving under him, merits appropation; and Lieut. De Starck, of the Millbrook, appears to have exemplified the zeal and energy which invariably attaches to his character.

The Millbrook was flruck feveral times by thot, but not damaged, and will proceed upon fervice this evening.

His Majefty's Sloop Merlin, off Dunkirk'
Sir., Oct. 28. 1823.

I have the honour to inform you, that the boats of his Majefty's floop Merlin, under my command, yelferday went in purfuit of, and drove on thore and totally defroyed the French lugger privateer Less Scpt Fieres, mounting two carriage guns, befides fmall arms, and manned with 30 men, commanded by the Citizen Pollet; the boats of the Alerlin were commanded by Lieut. Henry Clement Thompson, who has lest an arm in the service of his King of Price Supence. I

The lugger went on shore about half a mile to the westward of Gravelines; Lieutenant Starck anchored the Millbrook within musket shot of her, and in the evening a heavy fire was opened upon her from the shore with some field pieces, which, however, did no fort of damage; land I am happy to say, that on our fide not a man was hurt.

I flatter myfelf, Sir, that the conduct of the officers and men employed on this fervice will meet with your approbation.
