Alteration of Parish Areas.

ADJUSTMENT ORDER No. IX.

(PARISH OF ARDGOUR.)

HEREAS a new Parish, called the Parish of Ardgour, was constituted by an Order of the Secretary for Scotland, published in the Edinburgh Gazette of the 12th March 1895 (No. XVII.);

And whereas it is desirable to make provision consequential on the said Order regarding the allocation of the contribution from the Local Taxation Account to the cost of Poor Law Medical Relief in the said new Parish;

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows:—

- 1. The share of the contribution to the cost of the Poor Law Medical Relief in Scotland, accruing annually to the Parish of Kilmallie, shall be allocated between the two Parishes of Kilmallie and Ardgour in proportion to the vouched admissible expenditure in each on Medical Relief during the year.
- 2. Notwithstanding the date hereof, this Order shall take effect as from and after the 15th day of May 1895.

Alteration of Parish Areas.

ADJUSTMENT ORDER No. X.

(PARISH OF TEVIOTHEAD.)

WHEREAS a new Parish, called the Parish of Teviothead, was constituted by an Order of the Secretary for Scotland, published in the Edinburgh Gazette of the 8th March 1895 (No. XI.);

And whereas it is desirable to make provision consequential on the said Order regarding the allocation of the contribution from the Local Taxation Account to the cost of Poor Law Medical Relief in the said new Parish;

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh. Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Local Government (Scotland) Acts, order as follows:—

1. The total of the shares of the contribution to the cost of the Poor Law Medical Relief in Scotland, accruing annually to the Parishes of Hawick and Cavers, shall be allocated between the three Parishes of Hawick, Cavers, and Teviothead in proportion to the vouched admissible expenditure in each on Medical Relief during the year.

2. Notwithstanding the date hereof, this Order shall take effect as from and after the 15th day of May 1895.
