time for Rod Fishing on the River Earn.

THE Right Honourable Alexander Hugh, Lord Balfour of Burleigh, Her Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, having carefully considered the prayer of the Petition laid before me by the District Board of the River Tay, in terms of the 9th section of the Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868, for an alteration of the Annual Close Time for Rod Fishing applicable to the River Earn, a tributary of the River Tay, and being satisfied that the requisite statutory formalities have been duly complied with by the said District Board, and that it is expedient and desirable that the Annual Close Time for Rod Fishing applicable to the River Earn should be altered, do hereby, in virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Salmon Fisheries (Scotland) Act, 1868, as read along with the Secretary for Scotland Act, 1885, order, in terms of the prayer of the said Petition, that the Annual Close Time for Rod Fishing applicable to the River Earn shall be altered, so that the period for Rod Fishing shall in future be from the 1st day of February to the 31st day of October, both days inclusive in each year, and I do hereby direct that this Order shall be published in the Edinburgh Gazette of 16th October 1896.
