By the QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Saturday the thirty-first day of October instant; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday the tenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twenty-sixth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN.

At the Court at Balmoral, the 26th day of October 1896.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

It is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Friday the eleventh day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and the that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.
