A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Saturday the thirty-first day of October instant; We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby issue Our Royal Proclamation, and publish and declare that the said Parliament be further prorogued to Thursday the tenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twenty-sixth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Our Reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN.

At the Court at Balmoral, the 26th day of October 1896.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

It is this day ordered by Her Majesty in Council that the Convocations of the Provinces of Canterbury and York be prorogued from the day to which the same now stand prorogued to Friday the eleventh day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause Writs to be prepared and issued in the usual manner for proroguing the Convocations accordingly.

The Right Honourable Sir Matthew White Ridley, Bart., one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has appointed Charles Lawson Robinson, Esq., to be an Assistant Inspector of Mines under the Coal Mines Regulation Act, 1887, and has directed him to act also as an Inspector for the purposes of the Metalliferous Mines Regulation Acts, 1872 and 1875, and of the Quarries Act, 1894; and has, further, appointed him to be an Inspector of Factories and Workshops for the purposes of the Factory and Workshop Acts, 1878 to 1895.

INLAND TELEGRAM REGULATIONS, 1896.
