DOWNING-STREET, Nov. 15.

A dispatch, of which the following is a copy, was yesterday received by the Right Hon. Lord Hobart, one of his Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, from General Grinsield, Commander of his Majesty's troops in the Windward and Leeward Caribbee Islands:—

Demarara, Starbrock, Sept. 20. 1803. Mr Lord,

I have the honour to acquaint your Lordship of the furrender of this colony and Essequibo, which capitulated yesterday, and this day we are in possession.

I take the opportunity of a vessel going to Bar-badoes to send this, with the hope of its reaching your Lordship sooner than that which Com-modore Hood and myself shall dispatch as soon

as we can convey more particulars.

ADMIRALTY OFFICE, Nov. 15. Copy of a dispatch from Commodore SAMUEL HOOD, Commander in Chief of his Majesty's ships and ver-fels at the Leeward Islands, to Sir Evan Nepean, Bart. dated on board his Majefty's fhip Centaur, off Demarara, 20th September 1803.

SIR. Thinking it of the utmost importance to the mercantile interest the earliest information should be fent of the furrender of this colony, and that of Essequibo, to his Majesty's forces, I beg leave to acquaint you, for the information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the capitulation was figued on board the Heureux yesterday morning; in the evening the Hornet and Netley entered the river, and two hundred troops took possession of Fort William Frederick, and this day the colonies furrendered.

The Hippomenes ship corvette of eighteen guns, the only vessel of the Batavian Republic here, is included in the capitulation.
