**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.**

(DATED 22ND DECEMBER 1896.)

**ORKNEY (INFLUENZA AND STRANGLES) REVOCATION ORDER OF 1896.**

**T**HE Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Orders described in the Schedule to this Order are hereby, from and after the commencement of this Order, revoked: Provided that such revocation shall not invalidate or make unlawful anything done under the Orders hereby revoked, or either of them, or affect any licence or authority

granted, or any right, title, obligation, or liability accrued thereunder before the commencement of this Order, or interfere with the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of any offence committed against, or any penalty incurred under, the Orders hereby revoked, or either of them, before the commencement of this Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

3. This Order may be cited as the **ORKNEY (INFLUENZA AND STRANGLES) REVOCATION ORDER OF 1896.**
